

This month's featured article explores simple ways to honor your ancestors: share their stories, preserve their photos, and even bake a favorite family recipe to pass on both flavor and memory.



Check for New or Updated Ethnicity Estimates

Most testing companies refresh ethnicity results annually in the fall.

Tip: Revisit your ethnicity report and compare it to last year's version and make notes of any changes.
